

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF GREETWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON
MONDAY 1ST OCTOBER 2018 IN THE OLD SCHOOL, MILL HILL, NETTLEHAM**

80 -18/19 PARISHIONERS ITEMS

Mr Barrie Truelove of Truelove Property and Construction, presented a 30 year proposal for land owned by the company, situated to the North of the village, that is the fields between North Greetwell and Nettleham. Members expressed interest in the proposal but it was noted however that the land in question was not in Greetwell parish but that of Nettleham. It was suggested that this should be first presented to Nettleham Parish Council. The Chairman thanked Mr Truelove for attending the meeting.

A resident had complained about the use of the bus shelter and its perimeter, sited on the A158 opposite the petrol station, constantly being used as a toilet by those travelling on the A158. The Parish Council noted this and suggested preventative action was agreed.

A resident living on Wragby Road East had written to the Parish Council with concern about the speed of traffic on the A158 and her concern about the ingress to her property. The Parish Council sympathised with the resident noting her comments. It was pointed out that despite the best efforts by the Parish Council the County Council would not support a crossing over the A158 which would naturally slow the traffic down. It was hoped that if the village gateways were eventually sited this would have an effect. It was also noted that there had been little uptake from residents for the 40mph wheelie bin stickers - a further effort to help to assist in the speed of the traffic.

Report from District Councillors Anne Welburn and Maureen Palmer:-

'The **EMAS** report and **Police Commissioner** report presented at recent meetings that we have attended, have been circulated for your information. They do contain many initiatives that Councillors may find interesting.

The State of the District, the report for 2018 is now available and has been circulated. **West Lindsey District Council is seeking the views of residents on its budget for the next financial year.** Residents can take part via the online budget tool or attendance at one of two remaining events in the district. The events will give people a chance to understand the current situation and to give their views on how this affects the community.

Views are being sought on the following:

Council tax level, Cost of services, Fees and charges, Joint working with third party organisations

The council is also asking people how the New Homes Bonus government grant will be utilized in West Lindsey. Options include: providing an allocation based on the number of new properties in a parish, an allocation through a communities grant finding scheme, or use all the new homes bonus to support growth and regeneration across the district. The new Centre of engineering excellence officially opened in the town and it is down to a unique partnership that has made it possible. The Greater Lincolnshire Local Enterprise Partnership (GLLEP) is supporting the Made In Gainsborough Initiative and has contributed £12,913 for the first phase of the project and a provisional future allocation of £14,492 has been agreed for phase. This will support the re-location of milling and turning provision to Gainsborough in year 2. Key engineering companies in Gainsborough, which manufacture products worldwide said they were competing to fill vacancies and struggling to find local training. The challenge is to sustain this important industrial sector in a difficult economic environment and a critical part of this will be to grow talent and skills within the area.

West Lindsey District Council is seeking the views of residents about plans to develop a new £6.3 million leisure facility in Market Rasen. The new state of the art facility would include a 3G Pitch, fitness suite, dance studio, sports hall and changing facilities and could be open in June 2020.

The council has been aware of the lack of leisure provision in the market town for several years. It has successfully re tendered its existing leisure contract combining it with the West Lindsey Leisure Centre offer, to be able to extend provision across the district.

WLDC is delighted to announce that the Heritage Lottery Fund has awarded a £450,000 grant to a project to commemorate the Pilgrims' heritage.
