Money Available for projects in the Lincolnshire Wolds - Lincolnshire Wolds Countryside Service (LWCS) are pleased to announce two grant schemes for projects that directly benefit the Lincolnshire Wolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This funding is available to organisations, individuals or business, with both small and large grants available.

West Lindsey's leisure contract came into force on the 1st June. Recently awarded to Everyone Active, the leisure contract will run for a term of fifteen years with the potential to extend this for a further five years. £7.8 million of capital has been secured to support the development of the leisure service which provides for: Refurbishment of West Lindsey Leisure Centre and the introduction of a health and wellbeing hub. A new purpose built dry leisure centre in Market Rasen. A district wide outreach service which will take activities out into local communities and provide support and assistance. Contract outcomes linked to health benefits and closer relations with health professionals.

In addition to a net revenue benefit of £2.47 million the new contract provides a radical transformation of the Council's leisure offering a secure and sustainable position for the leisure service over the next fifteen years.

A National Lottery grant could lead to a £1.8 million boost for Gainsborough. Following a highly competitive national application process, West Lindsey District Council has been successful in achieving a National Lottery development grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF). The money is ring-fenced to restore the 'historic heart' of Gainsborough and will focus on the restoration of historic buildings and heritage assets in the town centre,

Vital assistance to help people live safely at home - Grants to help disabled people adapt their properties to make them safer are now available thanks to a new policy. A new discretionary Disabled Facilities Grant of up to £10,000 is now available to provide adaptations over and above what could previously be offered under a Mandatory grant. In addition, a Healthy Homes Grant of up to £5,000 is available to address issues such as damp, mould excess cold and reduce falls on stairs etc. This aims to improve the property standards of vulnerable people who own their own home and whose property standard is affecting their health.

District Councillor Mrs Maureen Palmer offered funds from her Community Initiative Fund towards expenditure on items for the Garden Party, Wheelie Bin stickers and refurbishment of seat on Westfield Drive, if required.
