

LET'S KEEP GREETWELL TIDY

The Queen's Green Canopy

At the beginning of 2022 Greetwell Parish Council asked residents how they would like to celebrate the Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee, and unfortunately we only received a couple of suggestions.

However, one of the suggestions was for a tree-planting ceremony and the Parish Council made enquiries with the County Council about a small triangle of land at the junction of the A158 with the new Eastern bypass.

The Parish Council has been given permission to plant some trees on this small patch of ground, and to this end an application was made to the Woodland Trust for a pack of saplings. The application has been successful the Council will receive a 'Small Urban Space' pack containing 15 saplings. The saplings will be delivered between 31st October and 11th November for planting sometime after 15th November (date to be confirmed after the pack has been received).

The Parish Council would like this planting to be a community enterprise and to this end residents are asked if they would like to be involved with the tree planting.

If you would be interested in helping with this continuation of the late Queen's wishes to create a green canopy please let any member of the Parish Council know. You will need warm clothing and a spade!

News from your Parish Council

Pedestrian Crossing – A Projects Officer has been appointed for the Pedestrian Crossing but progress is still very slow. County Councillor Ian Fleetwood has been asked to press the importance of the crossing for North Greetwell residents with Lincolnshire County Council Highways Department.

Street furniture on Lincoln Eastern bypass – The Parish Council has enquired (again) to Lincolnshire County Council for the provision of street furniture along the footway of the bypass. In particular bins, dog bins and seats would be welcomed.

Community Speedwatch – None has been carried out recently as it would be preferable for this to done on a Sunday morning when the traffic is particularly heavy. Unfortunately no volunteers have been available to assist.

However, the recent statistics from the speed indicator were that in July 343,683 vehicles had travelled the A158 through North Greetwell, the total in combined directions. The maximum speed registered was at 10.00pm on 11th July travelling at 99mph towards the city. This however could have been a blue light vehicle.

Dog poo in North Greetwell – This is still a problem and not a pleasant one. So the message to the few irresponsible dog owners is clear – please when exercising your animals make sure you have a supply of poop bags with you, use them when needed and dispose of them properly in the bins provided. Alternatively, double bagged dog waste can be disposed with domestic refuse in the black wheeled bins.

Westfield Drive corner - Thanks are extended to Andrew Fielding who has kept the flower tubs on the corner of Westfield Drive looking colourful all through the summer even in this dry weather.

The seat has also had a coat of varnish and the corner is looking good.

Freedom Never Gets Old.....

is a new campaign designed to encourage people entitled to the English National Concessionary bus pass in Lincolnshire to get back on their bus services.

As people resume more familiar daily routines including shopping, seeing friends, accessing important services, and the simple enjoyment of travelling around our beautiful Lincolnshire landscapes and market towns, it is evident that many are missing out on free bus travel.

Older people were among those who experienced the longest and most severe restrictions during the pandemic and are now in need of support and encouragement to reconnect with bus services Your bus service needs you - so how do you get a bus pass.

ELIGIBILITY: You must have reached state pension age to be eligible for the English National Concessionary travel scheme (NB Different rules apply to different regions of the UK).

HOW TO APPLY: You can apply online at Lincolnshire County Council or by telephone 0345 456 4474 - help is at hand - You will receive your pass within 10 working days. At peak times this may take longer.

The many benefits of free bus travel.....

The Freedom Never Gets Old campaign aims to reassure, enable and inform bus pass holders about free bus travel, explaining how the bus pass is a brilliant benefit and have a positive impact on their lives that won't cost them a penny.

- Saving Money Using a bus pass and traveling for free can save money on petrol, parking, taxi fares or paying friends or family for car journeys.
- Mental health and wellbeing Saving money is always a bonus and it certainly helps reduce financial worries. There is no doubting the benefits of getting out in the community, connecting with people and places.
- Preventing loneliness Getting on a bus can be a social activity from saying hello to the driver, meeting and making friends to positives of 'changing scenery' by visiting neighbouring villages to market towns.
- Access to services planning a journey by bus may seem daunting but with the help of the Transport Helpline - 0345 456 4474 - many journeys using a bus pass are possible.
- Helping protect bus services Bus service need passengers. Although bus pass holders do not pay fares, their journeys are subsidised by the local transport authority and therefore support the bus operator.

News from District Councillor Mrs Anne Welburn

RAF SCAMPTON – West Lindsey District Council is inviting bids from developers and investors to become a delivery partner for RAF Scampton. The Council is looking to procure, pursuant to a competitive dialogue procurement process, a suitably qualified partner organisation to regenerate and redevelop the site currently known as RAF Scampton.

As previously reported, the Council formally submitted an expression of interest in acquiring the site, which could contribute significantly to the 'Levelling Up' of economic and social outcomes across West Lindsey, Lincolnshire and beyond.

Should the Council be successful in acquiring the site, the successful partner will be required to work with the council and take a lead in managing, master planning and regenerating the site. The Council's expression of interest remains subject to a number of conditions. Work continues with the Defence Infrastructure Organisation on behalf of the Ministry of Defence and the Council hopes to make a final decision in relation to the acquisition and appointment of partner by the end of the year.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY - West Lindsey District Council will be switching its electricity tariff with its current provider as soon as contracts allow in October, to one that is 100 per cent traceable and zero carbon.

This will ensure any payments to its energy supplier is funding renewable energy sources only. The move supports the Council's target of becoming net zero carbon before 2050.

The green energy market can be complex, with many companies now offering competitive green electricity tariffs for both residential properties and businesses. The Council is pleased to have secured a deal that will mean that nearly 500,000 kwh used annually in its own buildings and assets now comes from 100% renewable sources such as solar or wind – saving the equivalent of more than 100 tonnes of C02 emissions annually.

The new electricity product ensures that 100 per cent of the REGO certificates are purchased from primary sources of renewable electricity generated solely via wind, solar and hydro.

CREMATORIUM RECYCLING SCHEME SUPPORTS TWO LINCOLNSHIRE

CHARITIES - LIVES, Lincolnshire, and St Andrew's Hospice have received an outstanding £27,000 charitable donation between them both from Lea Fields Crematorium, which is run by West Lindsey District Council. As previously reported, West Lindsey District Council opened the crematorium in January 2020 and signed up to a national metal recycling scheme to help give something back to the community. The ICCM (Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management) Metal Recycling Scheme, was set up so that with the consent from families, orthopaedic implants recovered after cremation are recycled and any money raised is used to give back to bereavement related charities.

Nationally the ICCM recycling Metal Scheme has raised over £7 million for charities since it was created.

COUNCIL IS 'PERFORMING WELL' CONFIRMS ANNUAL AUDIT - West Lindsey District Council has received a high rated assurance in its annual audit report for 2021-22. Inspectors from Assurance Lincolnshire carried out reviews into the governance, risk, internal controls, and financial controls of the council. The Council was found to be performing well in three areas with no significant concerns that would impact the council delivering its priorities.

Audit reviews across the financial control areas continues to provide positive assurance for the Council. The most recent audits for all of these have provided High and Substantial assurances particularly in Housing Benefit Subsidy, Grants Awarded and Value for Money.

The full report, which has been published on the Council's website, is based on the work auditors undertook and information from other sources of assurance, which gave the following opinion:

"For the twelve months ended 31 March 2022 the Council's arrangements for governance, risk management and control framework have continued to be strong."

2022 TOURISM AWARDS - Destination Lincolnshire has announced the finalists in their 2022 Tourism Awards and WL are thrilled that the Trinity Arts Centre is among those named. HELP US MAKE SURE OUR BUDGET HAS THE BIGGEST IMPACT FOR THE

<u>DISTRICT</u> - West Lindsey District Council has launched its annual budget consultation and is calling on residents and businesses to have their say on shaping future priorities.

Each year the Council asks local people what they would like to see the budget to focus on as we want to deliver positive outcomes for the district.

This year survey questions ask if the following should be a priority:

- 1. More enforcement should the council focus on issues such as dog fouling, littering, on street parking enforcement
- 2. Do you think it is important for the council to provide and enhance leisure and cultural services such as Market Rasen Leisure Centre and Trinity Arts centre?
- 3. Help with the cost-of-living increase

The Council is looking to set its budget for 2023 to 2024 and launched the consultation Monday 15 August 2022. Surveys are available online for people to understand the current financial situation and share their priorities.

Councillors are acutely aware of pressures caused by the increase in the cost of living and over the next few months we will be holding a Cost-of-Living summit to work with residents, businesses, schools, and community groups. The guidance for the wearing of face coverings in healthcare settings changed briefly in the early summer but due to the increase in COVID cases has been reverted back so that face coverings are required to be worn by staff and all patients when entering one of the surgery sites. Please help us, by coming to the practice wearing a face covering as this offers protection to all. Thank you

Flu & Covid Booster Vaccinations

It feels very strange to be writing this article when it is over 30 degrees outside and the sun is shining but at the practice we are starting to plan and organise our flu vaccination clinic. The practice is due its first delivery of vaccines at the end of September and a second one in late October so we are planning to be open on three Saturdays during October for booked appointments. We are hoping to be able to offer and give the covid vaccination booster at the same time (subject to an individual's eligibility) but as delivery of covid vaccinations is totally outside of the practice's control, we will not be able to confirm this until the time. The eligibility groups for flu vaccines this year are as follows:

- •all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2022
- •those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- •those aged 65 years and over
- those in long-stay residential care homes
- •carers
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- From the end of October we will also be able to offer flu and hopefully covid vaccinations to health patients aged 50-64

Extended Access

Thank you to all patients who responded to a text message that they received asking for their thoughts and opinions on the extended access service that will be offered by the PCN from 1st October 2022. The PCN has now submitted its proposal to Lincolnshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) and are awaiting to hear if it has been approved. If the PCN receives approval, Nettleham will continue to open until 8pm on a Thursday evening for appointments with nurses and a GP. Other PCN practices will be offering appointments on the other week day evenings until 8pm. One of the practices within the PCN will then be open on a Saturday from 9:00am - 5:00pm on a rota system so you may be offered an appointment at a different practice if you require a weekend appointment. None of the practices will be open on Sundays and Bank Holidays as the demand for these appointments has been very small over the last 3 years.

Annual Reviews

Since COVID has delayed a lot of our patients' annual reviews, we've taken the decision to move everyone to a "month of birth" system.

This will help everyone know when their review is due and help ensure that going forward everyone will receive one review per year (the medication review year goes from April to March each year).

You don't need to do anything at this stage as you will be invited in due course. While we move everyone across to this new system you may notice:

- > two annual reviews closer together or further apart
- you may be invited for an interim check to ensure it's safe for you to go until your birth month when you'll have the full review.
