**Report from District Councillor Anne Welburn** - West Lindsey District Council has praised residents after a successful first week of purple-lidded bin collections! Figures show that a staggering 98.5 per cent of all the new bins presented at the kerbside since Monday 18 April were emptied.

We can see that participation with the scheme is really high and contamination of the paper/card stream is really low, to date almost 80 tonnes of extremely high-quality material has been collected and delivered to Gainsborough Waste Transfer Station.

Lincolnshire County Council has a countywide mission to roll out the new scheme across the whole of Lincolnshire by 2024. So far West Lindsey is the third local authority to roll out a new twin stream recycling collection, following Boston Borough Council and North Kesteven District Council.

Only dry and clean paper and cardboard should go in the new purple-lidded bin, for example frozen food boxes, newspapers, envelopes, magazines, junk mail and cardboard parcel packaging. They should all go in loose and not bagged.

Waste that is placed in black bins is sent to the Energy from Waste plant at North Hykeham where it's turned into clean electricity and fed back to the grid.

From Monday 2 May the Council will not empty bins with incorrect items including paper and card as it continues its campaign to reduce contamination of its recycling materials.

### **What can go in the blue recycling bin?**

Cans, plastic bottles, glass bottles and jars, metal cans and tins, foil, aerosols, cleaning product bottles, toiletry bottles, plastic pots, tubs and trays, cartons, bottle lid tops, all clean, dry, squashed, and loose.

### **What cannot go in your blue bin?**

Paper and cardboard, soft plastics such as film/crisp packets, food pouches, plastic bags, batteries or electrical items, polystyrene, clothes and textiles, hard plastics such as old toys, plant pots and no black or brown plastic food trays.

### **Residents are also reminded that no side waste will be taken from any of the waste collections in West Lindsey.**

### **Green Homes Grant**

At the end of March WL had 68 households signed up and qualified to receive energy saving measures, of these households 29 had already received their install (ASHP/ Solar PV) All installs under GHG LAD2 must be completed by the end of June. WL have received many more applications and envisage these will rollover for the next round of funding. As they are on target with the delivery it does appear the full budget allocation of £560,000 will be spent.

I'm not sure which delivery partner and who specifically has been contacted, I meet regularly with YES who provide the customer journey support, and EON who are responsible for the installations. I am meeting with EON again next week and can provide further updates after this. If there are any particular queries, I can assist with I'm happy to speak with Members.

As pointed out not all properties are suitable for ASHP, for the LAD3 and Home Upgrade Grant (HUG) we have expanded the measures we offer. It will include, cavity, loft, under floor and external wall insulation, solar PV, ASHP and high retention storage heaters. The website will be updated shortly as we are almost in a position to launch and start marketing for this."

### **Scampton**

West Lindsey District Council has submitted an expression of interest for the acquisition of RAF Scampton. Councillors made the decision as the Ministry of Defence's disposal strategy, allows all public sector bodies the opportunity to express an interest in acquiring the site, prior to assets being listed on the open market.

The closure of RAF Scampton was announced by the Ministry of Defence (MOD) in 2018 as part of cost cutting measures. Since this time officers have worked closely with the community, MOD, the RAF, and potential investors to understand opportunities for the future of the site.

As previously reported as part of the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan, RAF Scampton has been identified as an 'opportunity area'. As such a new policy S74 was added to the draft Local Plan which requires the preparation of a masterplan in conjunction with, and for approval by, the district council prior to a planning application being submitted.

### **New Web Site**

West Lindsey District Council has launched a new outward-facing website, which residents and visitors will already be able to access.

The website, which was officially launched on 1 April 2022, replicates the old website but includes noticeable new additions, including changes to the Homepage, structure, and the menu in particular, helping residents find what they are looking for quicker.

The new design, created in partnership with Design and Development company Big Blue Door Ltd, will future proof the site to ensure the advancement of new technology can be easier to develop.

Residents across Lincolnshire are being invited to take part in a survey to understand how prepared they are for emergencies.

The LRFs aim to plan and prepare for localised incidents and major emergencies. They work to identify potential risks and produce emergency plans to either prevent or mitigate the impact of any incident on their local communities.

The survey opens on 4 April 2022 and will be open for 8 weeks, closing at midnight on Friday 27 May 2022. The survey is estimated to take approximately seven minutes to complete. There are 17 questions in total but how many you answer will depend on your answers to each question.

The result of this survey will be made available to the public and the results will be used to inform a promotional campaign.

## **Energy Rebate**

They are paying those council taxpayers who paid by direct debit on 1st April where they fulfil the Government criteria that on 1st April 2022:

1. The person was the liable council taxpayer for the eligible property above, and
  - a. the property was valued in council tax bands A to D, or
  - b. is a property valued in Band E but that received a disabled band reduction affording an alternative valuation band of Band D.
2. the property was someone's sole or main residence
3. it is/was a chargeable dwelling
4. the direct debit bank account name matches the council tax account holder name

Please note that where the bank account name is in a maiden name, but the council tax account name has been changed due to marriage these payments may not have been paid as they are not a match. We are also unable to make payments where the landlord or a company pay the council tax on someone's behalf.

We will be paying over 13,000 accounts at a cost of just over £1.9m
