#### **GREETWELL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

**New Member** - The Council welcomes Mr Alex Harris, resident of Lawley Close, as a member of the Parish Council.

**Tackling speed on Wragby Road East – The** Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) launched the Community Speed Watch (CSW) initiative in 2014 with the aim of enabling residents to tackle local speeding issues. In 2018 there are more than 200 parishes and town councils operating the scheme throughout the county.

Community Speed Watch uses highly visible passive notices (hopefully you have noticed these on Wragby Road East – they have recently been renewed as the previous ones were quite dull and faded).

Now, for the first time, Community Speed Watch members can also register to carry out speed checks in a controlled and authorised manner within their own parish. Registered keepers of vehicles exceeding the speed limit will be sent letters of advice from the police. This scheme could only be operated with assistance from local residents. Any resident who would like to be involved please contact any member of the Parish Council or the Parish Clerk.

The Parish Council has also been supplied with 100 A4 size Wheelie Bin Stickers depicting '40MPH'. If any resident on Wragby Road East would like some to stick on their bins please contact Councillors John Taylor or Sarah Bates. If several residents have these on their bins this should make an impact on Wragby Road East for at least one day each week.

Seat Westfield Drive - Westfield Drive - This has been refurbished.

**Tubs on corner of Westfield Drive –** A local resident is kindly tending these tubs.

**Grant –** District Councillor Mrs Maureen Palmer has offered a grant from her Initiative fund to cover the cost of Wheelie Bin Stickers, Toilet hire for the Garden Party and refurbishment of the seat on the corner of Westfield Drive.

**See Saw – The Chase Play Area –** This has had to be removed temporarily due to a broken spring. The Parish Council approved the repair cost of £490 at its July meeting – This payment will come from the Section 106 Agreement monies dedicated to The Chase.

#### **News from District Councilor's Anne Welburn and Maureen Palmer**

Vital assistance to help people live safely at home - Grants to help disabled people adapt their properties to make them safer are now available thanks to a new policy. A new discretionary Disabled Facilities Grant of up to £10,000 is now available to provide adaptations over and above what could previously be offered under a Mandatory grant. In addition, a Healthy Homes Grant of up to £5,000 is available to address issues such as damp, mould excess cold and reduce falls on stairs etc. This aims to improve the property standards of vulnerable people who own their own home and whose property standard is affecting their health.

West Lindsey's leisure contract came into force on the 1st June. Recently awarded to Everyone Active, the leisure contract will run for a term of fifteen years with the potential to extend this for a further five years. £7.8 million of capital has been secured to support the development of the leisure service which provides for: Refurbishment of West Lindsey Leisure Centre and the introduction of a health and wellbeing hub. A new purpose built dry leisure centre in Market Rasen. A district wide outreach service which will take activities out into local communities and provide support and assistance. Contract outcomes linked to health benefits and closer relations with health professionals.

In addition to a net revenue benefit of £2.47 million the new contract provides a radical transformation of the Council's leisure offering a secure and sustainable position for the leisure service over the next fifteen years.

## Lincoln Eastern Bypass archaeology road show

Next months Lincoln Eastern Bypass road show includes 'Meet the Archaeologist' drop-in events, a photography workshop and a pub quiz.



Cllr Richard Davies, executive member for highways, said:

"The volume of archaeology we've uncovered as part of the bypass project is unprecedented. In fact, it's one of the largest archaeological projects ever carried out in Lincolnshire.

"Because of this, it's really important to offer people the chance to find out more about the rich history that's been discovered underneath their feet.

"That's why these events will offer the opportunity to meet the archaeology team, see some of the spectacular ancient artefacts that have been discovered and experience what's involved in carrying out such a large scale archaeological excavation."

The Lincoln Eastern Bypass archaeology road show includes:

#### Archaeology Road Show Drop-in Events, 12pm to 6pm

- Thursday 9 August at Washingborough Community Centre (LN4 1AB)
- Thursday 30 August at Cherry Willingham Village Hall (LN3 4DU)

Not only will visitors have the chance to meet the archaeologists and discover ancient artefacts, but there will also be a range of activities for young and old including sandbox archaeology digs and colouring for kids; archery; the chance to work with stone flints; and interactive archaeological site survey demonstrations.

In addition, visitors can meet representatives from Lincolnshire County Council and Galliford Try to discuss the bypass scheme and better understand what goes into constructing such a large piece of infrastructure.

All are welcome. No booking is necessary.

Refreshments will be available for a small donation.

New health plan for Lincolnshire revealed - A major new health strategy to improve the health and wellbeing of people in Lincolnshire has been published. Lincolnshire's Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy (JHWS) sets out what all Organisations need to do to help improve people's health and prevent ill health and follows extensive engagement with those working in health and care and the public. The work has been co-ordinated by the Health and Wellbeing Board - a group of senior leaders and Councillors from across Health and Care Organisations in the county.

Council offers high quality support for Lincolnshire's looked after children - Ofsted have praised the support and services provided for the 640 looked after children in Lincolnshire. Councillor Mrs Patricia Bradwell OBE, Executive Councillor for Children's Services, said: "Overall, inspectors found leaders to be ambitious for children in care, that they know their services well and prioritise resources to help social work to flourish. This results in stable and experienced teams who deliver high quality social work which improves outcomes for children in Lincolnshire. The council is always on the lookout for new foster carers. **5,000** people helped through domestic abuse by Lincolnshire partnership in **10** years - Nearly 5,000 adults and children have been kept safe and supported through domestic abuse, thanks to Organisations in Lincolnshire working together over the last ten years.

Support available for Young and Adult Carers - Young and Adult Carers are being asked to come forward and give feedback on their situation and the support they need. There's no need to struggle on your own, we can support you. The Lincolnshire Carers Service supports young adult carers aged 16-24 – email <a href="mailto:CarersService@lincolnshire.gov.uk">CarersService@lincolnshire.gov.uk</a>. In Lincolnshire, we want to ensure every Carer is recognised, valued, and supported to have good health and wellbeing and achieve their full potential. Almost 1500 young people under the age of 19 who have a caring role within the family home are supported by the County Council. However, it is estimated there are many more young people who do not identify themselves as Carers and are missing out on support.

Historic Lincolnshire documents return from Germany to Lincoln - The National Archives has successfully overseen the return to the Lincolnshire Archives of 19 volumes of manorial records which have been in Germany for a number of years. The records, from the manor of Moulton Harrington in Lincolnshire, date back to 1702 and represent over 200 years of community history.

**Call for fairer government highways funding for Lincolnshire -** The Council's Executive Member for Highways and Transport, Cllr Richard Davies, is calling on the Government put an end to decades of underfunding and invest more in Lincolnshire's roads.

The brand new North Sea Observatory located at Chapel Point, St Leonards Drive, Chapel St Leonards PE24 5XA, is now open to the public. The new building includes information and exhibitions on the local areas rich natural history, an art space, a café and public toilets, and serves as an impressive gateway to the Coastal Country Park. "This new attraction is something unique to Lincolnshire.

**Bastion in the Air at The Collection -** Bastion in the Air's second <u>exhibition</u> is now on show at The Collection, Lincoln, until September tracing the county's story of aviation development, production and defence during WW1. Central is the unknown story of the Munitionettes from Lincoln and Gainsborough who built more aircraft during WW1 than anywhere else in the country. This complements the major exhibition at <u>RAF Scampton</u>.
