The D Day 80 events is for all of Greetwell residents and much planning has gone into this by local residents supported by the Parish Council.

<u>D-DAY 80</u>

North Greetwell commemorates/celebrates the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings on the five beaches in Normandy, France, which took place on 6th June 1944.

Commemoration



On the 6th June, at 9.15pm, beacons will be lit around the country. As it is not suitable for North Greetwell to have a beacon we will be joining in by lighting an official Lamp of Peace. The flame in the lamp, along with the beacons, will represent the 'light of peace' that emerged from the dreadful darkness of war.

The lamp will be lit on the roundabout at the bottom of Westfield Avenue and there is a special international tribute which will be read out. All residents are invited to attend to

pay tribute to the many thousands who sacrificed so much.

Celebration

On Saturday 8th June, starting at 2pm, there will be a Free to Attend 40's themed Street Party on Westfield Avenue with activities drawing to a close at 5.15pm. A road closure from Lawley Close down to the roundabout has been applied for.

This will be a fun-filled afternoon/evening for all ages. Again, all residents are invited to attend. You could bring your own picnic or contribute to the food and drink which will be set out on tables for you.

There will be ice cream and hot dogs to purchase should you wish, and we are laying on free teas, coffees, soft drinks.

There will be a **Quiz** which will **40's** themed along with testing your knowledge on Greetwell.

Raffle tickets will be on sale and a Tombola. Proceeds from these and an auction will be split between our two charities, Help for Heroes and Royal British Legion.

40's music will be playing, **40's** outfits are optional. There will be prizes for the best adults outfit and general fancy dress for children.

Childrens games will be available all afternoon and also craft tables where anybody can design a paper aeroplane to be flown competitively towards the end of the afternoon, or design a flag.

There will also be a treasure hunt for the children who will be looking for pictures of war-time aeroplanes to match them up with a letter.

There will be a cake competition. You are invited to bake a cake to bring along (Judge will not be allowed to taste them as we will auction them afterwards!!). Prize for best Adults and best Children's entry.

If you can bring your own fold up chairs, tables or just a blanket on the ground, that would be great, although we do have some chairs. The idea is just to have a great time, with food, drink, music, laughter, an old-fashioned community street party, to which all residents will be welcome.

UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING OF GREETWELL HELD ON 22ND APRIL 2024 IN THE SUDBROOKE VILLAGE HALL

PRESENT: Councillor John Taylor (Chairman), Mrs Christine Myers (Clerk) 5 Residents

1 APPROVAL OF THE NOTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 3 APRIL 2023 TO BE SIGNED AS MINUTES

That the notes be signed as minutes proposed by Mr Vernon Stuffins, seconded by Mrs Sarah Bates.

2 CHAIRMANS REPORT

The Chairman reported as follows:-

That it had been another successful year for the Parish Council and thanked all members for their hard work and emphasised that it was a 'good team'.

The Clerk was thanked for her knowledge and admin skills and for keeping the Council on the 'straight and narrow'.

Thanks were made to the County and District Councillors whose valuable assistance is greatly appreciated.

The biggest event by far during the year had been the installation of the pedestrian crossing, which was achieved after many years of campaigning. The opening ceremony was a catalyst that made the Parish Council feel that people were interested in their local area.

This led to the Christmas tree lights event which was amazing. The number of people that turned out was a great encouragement. Hopefully this will be an ongoing local tradition.

We look forward this summer to the D Day 80 events that look as if they will be well and truly something to remember.

The Chair thanked all members of the Parish Council for their regular attendance at meetings and their willingness to put forward views and that of the community.

3 CLERKS REPORT

The Parish Council continues to be a hardworking team working for the benefit of the community. This resulted in a very well supported Christmas tree switch-on event on Westfield Avenue last December.

Mulled wine was purchased from the Events Fund, which has built up over time, and mince pies were kindly donated by our local garage. Plans are to make it a bigger event this coming year.

The tree and lights were purchased from Community Infrastructure Levy Funds which was paid to the Parish Council from newbuild properties in the parish.

Other events have included Litter Picks and Junior Litter Picks of which a resident started and these have proved popular involving some of the children from North Greetwell.

The Speed Indicator device was completely destroyed by a vehicle running into it in November last year. However, within two weeks the Parish Council insurance had reimbursed funds for replacement and a new one was ordered and received well within a month. We still await the post to be sited from the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership so that the device can be fixed to it.

The Parish Council had taken on the verge cutting from Ramper Farm to the village gateways last year, and received a contribution towards this from the County Council of £449.00 reducing the cost to the parish by half of what it paid. This will continue this year, keeping our parish tidier.

Planters – Councillor Jo Dimelow continues to plant and maintain the planters on Westfield Drive and Councillor Mrs Sarah Bates the large one near to the Greetwell sign on the A158 by Lodge Lane. This was refurbished last summer with the help of volunteers from Anglian Water.

The Parish received a grant of £400 from two of our District Councillors towards new seats for The Chase. These were kindly fixed in place by our County Councillor and a volunteer from Cherry Willingham Parish Council.

Financial Report:-

The Chase Account – expenditure for year taken from account - £3,503.55 including £100.00 administration fee = $\underline{£5,308.14}$

The Chase account is diminishing as Grass cutting, inspections and repairs are paid from it. Future costs for the maintenance of The Chase will require to be met from the Parish Precept.

At 31.3.2024 the Parish Council Account totalled £14,513.88

This amount includes:-

Events Fund - £805.16 Parish Enhancement - £5,250.28 Cil's monies £481.65 Contingency Fund = £ 7,976.79

The Accounts would be audited and available for residents to view.

4 REPORTS BY COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

There were no reports submitted.

There were none. The meeting ended at 7.37pm.

PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT

All homes will of course have received their Council Tax bills for this year. Your Council Tax is made up of a number of elements which fluctuate but determine the total amount charged.

This includes:-

Parish Precept (the amount the Parish Council requires to fund its services) Amount of grant from West Lindsey District Council Tax Base (the number of properties in the parish) Local Council Tax Support Scheme (amount of financial support given to Parishioners on low income) Council Tax Discounts and exemptions (e.g. single person discount)

Greetwell Parish Council Precept is made up as follows:-

Administration, including Staffing costs, Clerks expenses, LALC Membership, Website Maintenance, Room hire for meetings, Stationery/Computer cartridges -£9,595.00;

LALC Training courses/Mileage - £100.00; Information Commissioner annual fee - £35.00; Insurance - £295.00;

Audit - £100.00; Flower tubs - £50.00; Newsletter - £250.00;

Contingency Fund - £1000.00;

Defibrillator service charge - £100.00; Parish Enhancement Projects - £2000.00; Grounds maintenance - £400.00

Total = \pounds 13,926.00, Less \pounds 100 to be taken from The Chase Account for administration = \pounds 13,826.00.

PUFFIN CROSSING

An incident was brought to the attention of the Parish Council in that a car had failed to stop at the crossing on the A158 nearly resulting in a collision with a user. It is therefore suggested that residents should wait for the traffic to stop before stepping onto the crossing.

Anglian Water Pipeline

Residents have been enquiring as to why works have come to a stop on the blue water pipes sited at the end of Greetwell Lane.

The Parish Council made enquiries with Anglian Water and has received the following reply:-

'Currently the main works on the Elsham to Lincoln section of the pipeline has stopped as the overall delivery programme has changed because of a number of factors as highlighted below.

Due to exceptional circumstances, such as Covid, labour shortages, supply issues, (caused by the war in Ukraine), poor weather as well as rising inflation which has impacted many large infrastructure programmes.

Our Strategic Pipeline project is no exception. At Anglian Water, it is critical that we meet our obligations to provide water continuity to the south of the region. Our focus will be on the southern section (Etton to Colchester), the most environmentally sensitive areas which are facing water shortages without the new strategic pipeline.

This will mean in the north (Elsham to Etton), there will be very little activity this calendar year, with a revised programme being created for 2025 going forward.

We have always said this pipeline project is essential to ensure the dry, rapidlygrowing East of England remains resilient to drought and can serve the increasing population.

That has not changed and we remain 100% committed to delivering the entirety of the project and all of the environmental obligations associated with it.

We are also looking at whether we can reinstate fields sooner than next year across Elsham to Lincoln too but we are still waiting on this decision, as soon as I hear back I shall let you know.

We have a new Salaried GP joining the practice in July 2024, Dr Chris Graham who is relocating to Lincoln and Dr Sidra Maqsood will also be returning from maternity leave in October 2024.

CHERRY WILLINGHAM SURGERY - There have been several messages that we are aware of on social media recently in relation to the opening and staffing of Cherry Willingham Surgery. The surgery at Cherry Willingham is a branch site but we are pleased to say that it is open every weekday morning from 8:00am - 12:30pm and there is a GP and members of the nursing team working there each day. There are limited GP appointments at this site but if you can only attend the Cherry Willingham site, please make this clear in your AskMyGP request and we will try and accommodate this.

SPRING COVID VACCINATION BOOSTERS - It has recently been announced that there will be a Spring Covid Booster vaccination for the following three NHS groups of patients: COVID-19



- Patients aged 75 and over
- Residents in a care home for older adults
- Patients aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

I am pleased to say that we shall be able to offer the vaccination at the practice for the patients aged 75 and over and for immunosuppressed patients aged 18 and over from late April 2024 until 30th June 2024 at the Nettleham site in conjunction with Imp PCN. If the practice holds a mobile telephone number for you on your medical records, texts containing unique booking links will be sent out nearer the time once we know the actual delivery dates of the vaccines. If you do not have a mobile telephone number, please contact the practice after 10:30am from 22nd April 2024 and our receptionists will be happy to book an appointment for you on one of the clinic days. If you are unable to attend the practice for your vaccine, the practice can add you to a home visit list for the vaccination but please note that at present we have no information as to when or who will be conducting the home visits as it is not something that the practice has been commissioned to undertake.
