A Neighbourhood Plan for North Greetwell

A few years ago a group of residents began preparing to put together a Neighbourhood Plan for North Greetwell. Some of you may remember that we put on a display at one of the garden parties and also that we circulated a questionnaire regarding the need for a crossing over the A158. Your overwhelming responses were definitely instrumental in us finally achieving the crossing.

Unfortunately, in 2020 the Coronavirus lockdowns intervened and we had to stop having meetings. Before we were able to re-start, 3 of the committee members moved away from the village. As there is now the possibility of grants being available again I would like to find out if any more residents would like to become involved so that we can restart the process.

Myself and 2 other original members are available to arrange meetings. Help and support will be available from the District Council.

A Neighbourhood Plan is not a way of stopping development, but it gives us a chance to have some influence with design and layout. North Greetwell is described as a small village in the Local Plan and this is how I am sure you would all like it to remain.

There are going to be major changes to planning processes during this parliament and the government is expecting to build some 1.5 million new homes.

Could you join the North Greetwell Community Speed Watch Team?

The Community Speed Watch allows residents to become police-trained volunteers to monitor vehicle speeds in their communities, with the aim of changing the behaviour of road users who drive above the speed limit through small towns and villages.

There are more than 250 parishes and town councils operating the scheme throughout Lincolnshire with over 1000 trained volunteers.

The first time that a driver is caught speeding they will receive a 'first' letter. The intention of this is that you take on board the warning and therefore don't transgress again. Second and third letters are for repeat offenders. We have been joined for some sessions by Police Officers and they will subject any offenders to the relevant penalty.

Speeding is a priority raised at most local levels and the Community Speed Watch gives our community the ability to address speeding concerns within our own environment.

NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

Witham Valley Access Group proposal to pursue establishing a pathway connection between the A158 at Greetwell and the Bridleway that runs between Greetwell Lane and Nettleham – This is supported by Greetwell Parish Council as it is considered that, if established, it would be beneficial for Greetwell residents.

The Witham Valley Access Group will be making a presentation to the **Annual Parish Meeting of Greetwell at 7.30pm on Monday 7th April 2025.** Meeting to be held in the Bramham Lounge of Sudbrooke Village Hall. Residents are invited to come along to this meeting.

Planters for railings on the Puffin Crossing – Consideration is being given to having planters on the railings of the puffin crossing to brighten up the parish. The correct type for the railings are being sought for which permission has to be obtained from Lincolnshire County Council.

Crime incidents in the parish – There have been some vans broken into in the parish. Please be vigilant, back up to garages, leave in light areas. Any incident should be reported to the Police in order to increase the Police Officers carrying out patrols in our area.

Grass cutting in the parish - The verge cutting on the A158 from Ramper Farm to the parish gates will be increased to ten cuts during the season to make the parish appear more attractive when passing through. Residents are asked to keep obstacles of rocks/stones etc off the verge to enable a smooth cut for the contractors.

Footpath on A158 through North Greetwell – The Parish Council are pursuing, through County Councillor Ian Fleetwood, for the re-surfacing of the footpath running through North Greetwell.

The Chase Play area – The play area continues to be visually checked weekly by a member of the Parish Council and inspected monthly by a qualified Play Equipment Inspector. Repairs are carried out as advised to keep the equipment in tip top and safe condition.

Parish Council meetings – All residents are welcome to attend meetings of the Parish Council and speak under 'Parishioners Items' – dates listed later on in the magazine and on the parish website https://Greetwell.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk

Precept for 2025/26 - The sum of £17,000.00 has been precepted upon West Lindsey District Council for the forthcoming year made up from the following budgeted costs:-

Staffing costs - £9,303.00 Clerk's expenses - £400.00 LALC membership - £320.00 Website maintenance - £200.00 Stationery/computer cartridges - £75.00 Training - £100.00 Information Commissioner fee - £35.00 Insurance - £250.00 Internal Audit fees - £100.00 Flower tubs - £250.00 Newsletter (Greetwell News) - £250.00 Contingency Fund/Reserves - £1,000.00 Defibrillator service charge - £110.00 Events Fund – Nil *Parish Enhancement projects (to include play area repairs when funds are spent from The Chase account) - £4,000.00 Grounds maintenance - £500.00 Parish Council election - to be taken from contingency/reserves

*This has had to be increased from the last financial year due to increased costs but also to cover costs of The Chase Play Area when the allocated funds from its installation are exhausted.

Info - There are now 926 persons on the Greetwell Register of Electors, with additional street names of Bardney Crescent, Limewoods Way and Newball Crescent on the Cathedral View Estate.
