This year we have a speaker – Jo Blackwell from the Lincolnshire Police Independent Advisory Group – Jo says

'The group seeks to improve two way communication between the police and their communities. The role is to offer advice on the impact of police activity. The group isn't like a neighbourhood panel, where people would typically take their day to day concerns but it may, for example, get a sense of how the community feels about particular things and feedback how the police may be seeking to approach these things. The group's aim is to engender trust and confidence in police activities. We'd like local people to know that the group exists, that they are welcome to apply to join if they have an interest in policing matters and that as someone local I am keen that communication is improved in the area.'

Although arranged by the Parish Council, the **Annual Parish Meeting** is *not* a Parish Council meeting – but a meeting for residents.

Please do come along – there will be refreshments at the end of the meeting and chance for a chat.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ARE YOU FED UP OF SPEEDING TRAFFIC ON THE A158?

The Parish Council is constantly trying to help combat this problem. Several efforts are being made as follows:-

40mph stickers for wheelie bins – There has been little uptake from residents of Wragby Road East in the offer of the free A4 size wheelie bin stickers stating **'40mph'**. This is a simple but effective way of reminding motorists of the speed limit as they travel through North Greetwell.

Similarly, **30mph** wheelie bin stickers are now available for Westfield Drive depicting **30mph**.

Village Gateways - As mentioned in the last Greetwell News the Parish Council is hoping to install Village Gateways at the eastern end of the parish. Although £1000 has been precepted for the project as much again is required so it is hoping that some grant funding will be available in order to complete the project. These Gateways are known to have an effect in reducing the speed of traffic so it is hoped that the sooner they can be fitted the better it will be for North Greetwell on the busy A158.

Voluntary Speed Checks - The Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership is offering equipment to Parish Councils in order to undertake voluntary speed checks in their parishes/villages. This involves some training from the Partnership in the use of the radar equipment which will log the speed that individual motorists are travelling. If the vehicle is in excess of the speed limit the recording of the registration number will enable a letter to be sent by the Police to point out the speed that the vehicle was travelling (not the issuing of a fine).

Greetwell has been offered the chance to share the equipment purchased by Cherry Willingham Parish Council. If sufficient volunteers are recruited from Greetwell the scheme can be operated on the A158.

Neighbourhood Plan – a representative from Community Lincs came along to the February 2019 meeting of the Parish Council to talk about the production of a Neighbourhood Plan for Greetwell. West Lindsey District Council and Community Lincs are available to support a Working Group in order to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish. Having a Neighbourhood Plan enables communities to have more say in the development of their parish and also address some of the housing shortages.

A steering group of residents has been formed. If you have an interest in this and want to join the group please contact Councillor Mrs Sarah Bates.

Those residents living on the A158 will have noticed the increase in traffic due to the A158 being the diversion route for the temporary closure of a part of the Fiskerton Road due to works on the new Eastern Bypass. This will continue until Friday 6th April.



Have you ever considered attempting to play handbells? You do not need to be able to read music as we have pieces written with numbers – each bell has its own number

Recently I have acquired extra handbells, so we have vacancies for more players. We meet on a Monday

from 7.30-9.00 pm in Nettleham every fortnight. Each member pays a small amount each session to cover the cost of hiring the room with a little extra to keep in the bank should the bells need renovating. We would welcome residents from Greetwell and neighbouring villages.

Each rehearsal we practise pieces I have harmonised. I have always taken different music groups where I endeavour to try to make everyone relax with a great deal of laughter – don't worry if you play a wrong note because we all do this at some time. Recently one of my new members to my choir, who is usually very nervous, said that she felt the rehearsals were great fun.


Occasionally we visit nursing homes to entertain the residents, particularly round Christmas time. If we visit another venue to play for the audience, often I ask some of them to try to play the bells with our team giving them supervision – great fun. It is not as daunting as it sounds. If we are asked for concerts all members wear white tops and dark coloured trousers or skirt. The handbell scarf and tie are provided by Carillon Handbells. We would love you to contact me, and we will invite you to come to one of our practises. I would then gently let you try playing one bell – we all play at least two bells although one bell is usual for a beginner.

When you make the first move it will not be compulsory for you to join us permanently. However, you could try a few sessions to get the flavour of handbell playing.
